(Pets Are Worth Saving) is a non-profit organization whose roots go back to 1997. We provide care for the animals in the Flint, MI (Genesee County) area.

The main focus of our group is to rescue dogs, cats, puppies and kittens that are going to be euthanized and find them new loving homes. We are a "no-kill" rescue!

In a year, we typically take in over 300 dogs and cats. Our animals come from abused and neglected homes, the county animal control facility, and from owners who, for whatever reason, can no longer keep their pet. We have many animals with special needs. We give them all another chance.

"PAWS Animal Rescue is a non-profit organization that is passionately dedicated to saving abused, neglected, and abandoned animals. PAWS Guiding Values are: to prevent animals going to kill shelters, research facilities and animal control; to increase adoptions of unwanted animals to a loving forever home; to educate the public regarding the value of the animal's in their lives; to increase public awareness about the importance of spaying/neutering their pets; and to provide training and rehabilitation for the animals with adoption barriers."

All of our animals are housed in foster homes by our network of volunteers, as we do not have a shelter facility. Every weekend they load up animals, cages and supplies to take to our adoption location to show the animals.

"Pets In Peril" (PIP) is a program of PAWS. Special, dedicated volunteers go into under-privileged neighborhoods within Genesee County to feed, provide shelter, and supply vet care, when supplies permit. They work with owners to educate them on pet care to help make a brighter future for the animals of our county.
